• Summertime Activity Awards

- Cub Scouting is a year-round program.... September thru August. As such, it is the responsibility of every Scouting unit to ensure a quality Cub program, even during the summer. During the months of June, July, and August Cub Scouts and their families can participate in Scouting activities that are educational and fun!

A full summer program keeps a pack healthy, parents interested, and Cub Scouts eager to register for another year

- National Summertime Award Pin – Boy who attends all three Pack Summertime activities
 - National Summertime Pack Award Certificate – Pack who holds activities in June, July & August
 - National Summertime Pack Award Streamer – Pack who holds activities in June, July & August
 - National Summertime Den Participation Ribbon – Den with 50% or more of their boys at three summertime activities
- Requirements in Cub Scout Leader Book (No. 33221) Section 34-35

• Pack Overnights

- Pack overnights are pack-organized overnight camping activities involving more than one family from a single pack, focused on age-appropriate Cub Scout activities and conducted at council-approved locations (use Pack Overnighter Site Approval Form, No. 13-508). If nonmembers (siblings) participate, the program must be structured to accommodate them. BSA health and safety and Youth Protection guidelines apply. In most cases, each youth member will be under the supervision of a parent or guardian. In all cases, each youth participant is responsible to a specific adult.
- At least one adult giving leadership to a pack overnighter must complete Basic Adult Leader Outdoor Orientation (BALOO), No. 34162, and be present on campouts. BALOO trains participants to properly understand the importance of program intent, Youth Protection guidelines, health and safety, site selection, age-appropriate activities, and sufficient adult participation. Permits for campouts shall be issued locally, according to council policies. Packs use the Local Tour Permit Application, No. 34426.

• Local Summer Daycamps

- Cub Scout day camp is an organized, one to five-day theme-oriented program for Tiger Cubs and their adult partners, Cub Scouts, and Webelos Scouts. Day camp is conducted by the council/district under National Camp School leadership at an approved site during daylight or early evening hours. Day camps do not include any overnight activities. The day camp program is age-appropriate and theme-based and offers a variety of outdoor experiences, including sports.
- Cub Scout day camp programs should be geared to the physical and mental abilities of their specific age group. Program session time schedules and activities should be geared specifically for Tiger Cubs, with the involvement of their adult partners. This usually will require adjustment of an existing day camp program geared for Cub Scouts and Webelos Scouts.

• CubWorld at Camp William B. Snyder

- Cub Scout and Webelos Scout resident camping is a council-organized, theme oriented, overnight camping program. It operates for at least two nights and is conducted under trained leadership at a camp approved by the council. In most cases, each youth member will be under the supervision of a parent or guardian. In all cases, each youth participant is responsible to a specific adult.
